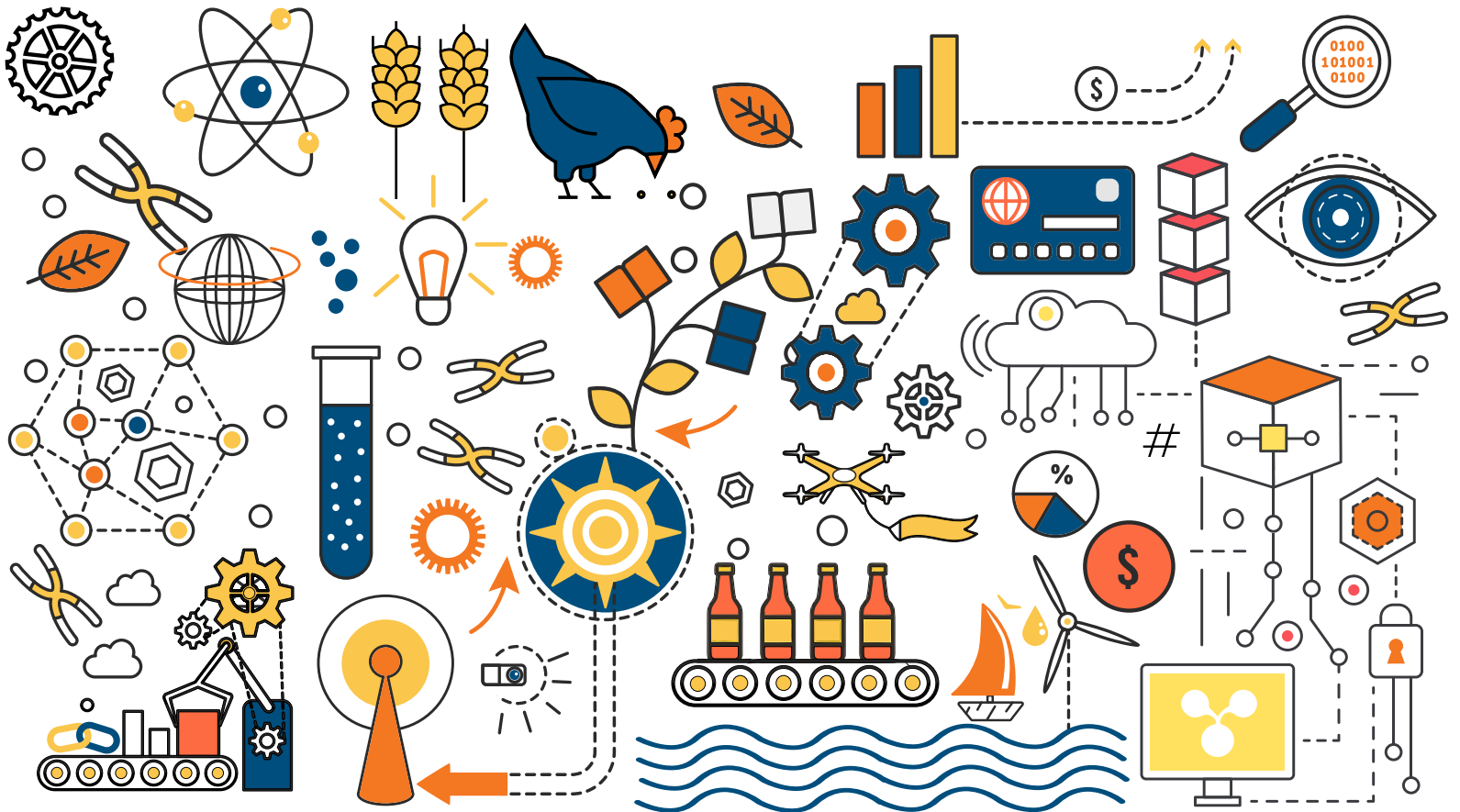

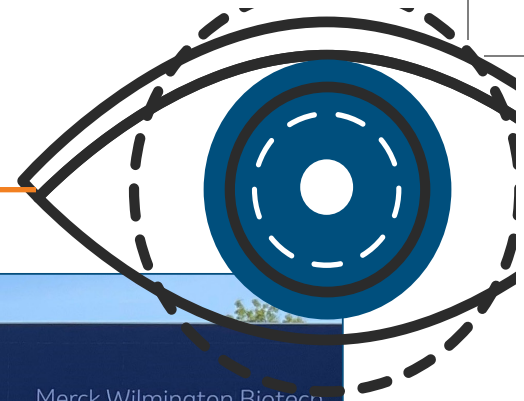

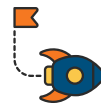

Merck Project is Largest Location in DPP History

Delaware's status as a manufacturing powerhouse in biopharmaceuticals was reinforced with the selection of Chestnut Run Innovation & Science Park (CRISP) for the \$1 billion, 470,000-square-foot Merck Biologics Center of Excellence in Wilmington.

DPP assisted Merck with its search in the spring of 2024 and supported the company's successful Delaware Strategic Fund grant request in February 2025. The global medicine and vaccine pioneer celebrated its decision to locate in Delaware with a groundbreaking ceremony at the site in April 2025. Merck was attracted to Delaware because of its deep regional science and technology talent pool and considers CRISP to be a dynamic hub for research and development, life sciences and manufacturing with room for continued growth. In addition to bringing 500 jobs to the state over five years and the potential for 1,500 additional local jobs with possible future expansion, Merck Wilmington Biotech will enhance Delaware's biotechnology ecosystem and further the state's reputation as a leader in life sciences innovation.



2025 Updates on Previous DPP-Supported Projects



AirJoule (2024 DPP announcement) celebrated its new 35,000-square-foot headquarters – which includes the company’s primary research, development, manufacturing and assembly operations – on Shea Way in Newark in July.



Solenis (2022 DPP announcement) cut the ribbon on its new 100,000-square-foot research and development center – which includes advanced labs, office facilities and customer service space – at Chestnut Run Innovation & Science Park in October.



Evernorth (2023 DPP announcement) opened its 200,000-square-foot Accredo Specialty Pharmacy warehouse with advanced robotic and automation technologies – which will allow the company to distribute more than 1.5 million prescriptions each year – in Newark’s First State Logistics Park in October.



Satys (2024 DPP announcement) officially unveiled its new 38,000-square-foot facility – which provides aircraft painting and sealing services for large business jets – at Wilmington ILG Airport in New Castle in October.

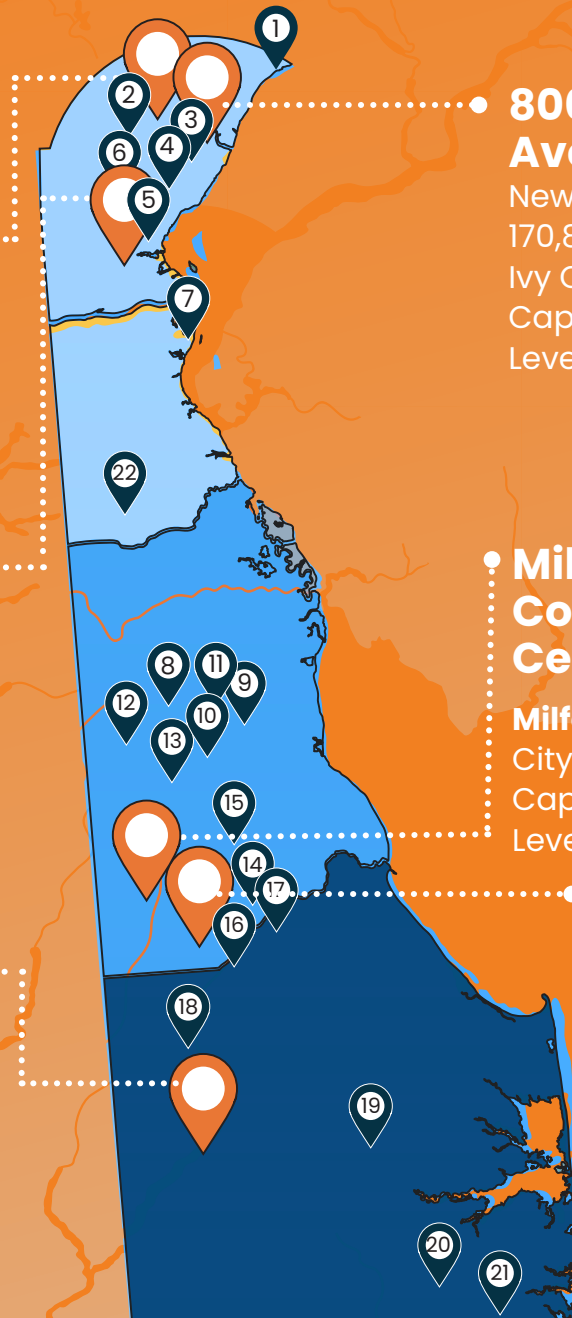

2025 AWARDS

PRIOR GRANTS



DPP supported six properties in their successful applications for Site Readiness Grant funding in 2025. The cumulative \$7.7 million awarded supports an overall anticipated investment of \$332.3 million by the property owners. Working with the Division of Small Business, DPP has now supported 30 Site Readiness Grant applications for 27 sites since DPP assisted the state in creating and launching the program in 2022. These awards reflect all-time capital investment by Site Readiness recipients of over \$1.89 billion.

INNOVATING TOWARD THE FUTURE

DPP Innovation Focuses on Expanding

Expansion of DPP's innovation and entrepreneurship programming emerged as a priority in 2025, and numerous steps taken during the year reflected that goal. Among these activities was the appointment of more than a dozen additional members to the DPP Board of Directors – most of whom hail from the entrepreneur, science and technology sectors of Delaware's business community – to give an increased depth of perspective around innovation in a variety of industries. Another activity was initiating development of new investment strategies for startup and emerging companies. To reflect this greater emphasis and broader focus, DPP's Innovation Team leader Noah Olson was promoted to Vice President of Innovation.

At the same time, the Innovation Team continued its work to strengthen the statewide innovation and entrepreneurship ecosystem through greater deployment of its existing practices. DPP engaged with 155 startup companies, assisting three of them with locating in Delaware and several others with market connections. DPP Innovation also continued advancing Delaware's presence in local, regional, national and international innovation networks by attending more than 60 sector events; completing a dozen speaking engagements, including the Bisnow Philadelphia Life Sciences Conference; serving on organization boards and planning committees; and judging key competitions across the state and region. Finally, DPP spread the word – addressing audiences including the New Castle County Chamber of Commerce State of the County conference – about the value and availability of the 2025 Statewide Science and Technology Assessment for others to use in their own strategic planning.



Grant Program Funds More Lab Growth

Delaware's Graduated Lab Space Grant helps create wet lab space for the state's growing science and technology industry. In 2025, DPP supported two successful applicants for Graduated Lab Space Grants: QPS (shown), which requested a \$1.1 million grant to expand its Delaware Technology Park site and Ally Nutra, which requested a grant of \$476,140 to expand its Dover facility. Since the program's establishment in 2021, DPP has supported 15 applications totaling nearly \$16.6 million – contributing toward \$122.2 million in private capital investment and anticipated creation of 776 jobs.

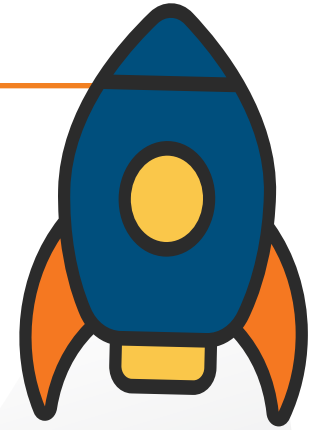


9 Ventures Share \$113K in Funding in 5th Startup302

DPP's fifth annual Startup302 saw nine early-stage companies with underrepresented founders win a share of \$113,500 in nondilutive grant funding. For the first time, the finals for the pitch competition were spread across a trio of industry-specific events to maximize awareness and networking opportunities within the competitors' sectors. Since its launch in 2021, Startup302 has had 583 companies apply to compete and 61 of them have shared more than \$926,500 in unrestricted grants. Of the winners, 21 have been homegrown ventures from Delaware and one – 2025 Environmental Impact winner KiposTech – chose to move operations to Delaware following the competition.

DPP Promotion Spans U.S and Reaches Around the Globe

2025 found DPP staff promoting Delaware through 34 targeted events in 13 states plus Washington, D.C., and seven other countries. Industry-specific messaging included Delaware's status as a nationally recognized destination for life science companies looking to expand and establish new research and development and manufacturing facilities. Outreach focused on foreign direct investment (FDI) aimed to convey why Delaware ranks 1st in FDI competitiveness, according to Business Facilities Magazine's 2025 State Rankings Report. Whether in the United States or abroad, these events and trips furthered Delaware as a destination for business expansion and cultivated connections with site selectors and other decisionmakers representing a range of sectors.

As a leadup to May's SelectUSA Investment Summit, DPP teamed with Choose New Jersey and Select Greater Philadelphia to host representatives of international healthcare companies and other influencers at a SelectUSA spinoff. The two-day "Healthcare Tech: An Inside Look at the Expertise and Innovation Driving the Mid-Atlantic's Largest Industry Sector" event touted Delaware Valley opportunities presented by the regional Advancing Photonics Technologies Innovation Engine and PROPEL Tech Hub. Delaware highlights included a bus tour of Wilmington's Chestnut Run Innovation & Science Park; a foot tour of Prelude Therapeutics; panel discussions at The Innovation Space; and a DPP-hosted reception at CSC Station.



LOCAL ENGAGEMENT & PROMOTION

Connection, Collaboration, Celebration and Support

Across Our State & Beyond

DPP crisscrossed the state and region to engage with the business community throughout New Castle, Kent and Sussex counties. Staff completed 39 speaking engagements, continued co-hosting bimonthly partners meetings with the Division of Small Business and highlighted collaborators across sectors with an Economic Development Week social media campaign that logged nearly 15,000 impressions. DPP's Research Team completed 82 research requests for prospects, state and local government agencies, private developers and the Delaware business community. DPP research also worked with the state Department of Education and the Delaware Workforce Development Board to broaden the definition of "geographic region" toward planning public education Pathways programs and established a partnership with the Council for Community and Economic Research to improve the quality of data collected for Delaware's cost-of-living index.

Impact of Existing Business Outreach Grows

DPP stepped up its formal Existing Business Retention & Expansion Engagement (BRE) program in 2025 and saw significant success. Three of DPP’s announcements for the year – Corteva, Sun Chemical and Ally Nutra – were retention projects, and they accounted for \$17.4 million in projected capital investment and 340 retained jobs. In all, DPP staff made 106 BRE visits to all three counties to engage with companies both new to DPP and those with long-established relationships. More than half of those visited also completed follow-up surveys that provide additional insight into each company’s goals and challenges and information about how DPP can best support them.

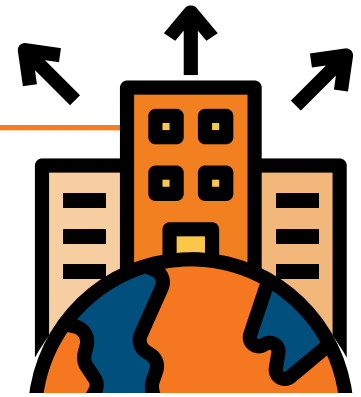
